The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority (SVGPA) is responsible for the safe operation and administration of the Kingstown Deep Water Harbour, the nearby Campden Park Container Port (CPCP), the Kingstown Cruise and Ferry Terminals and several small ports in the Grenadines.

Port Kingstown Deep Water Harbour first began operations in September 1964 and is located in the capital city, Kingstown. The main quay is 900ft with additional 121ft of catwalk with a water dept alongside of 30ft. The Port handles both containerized and general cargo. It also facilitates inter-island ferries and cruise ship services.

Campden Park Container Port is located just outside capital Kingstown, constructed in March 1993 at the Campden Park Industrial Estate. The Port is operated by the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority to specifically handle containers.

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority ("the Authority"), set out on pages 4 to 39, which comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2016, the statements of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, changes in equity and cash flows for the year then ended, and notes, comprising significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Authority as at December 31, 2016, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Authority in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code), and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements in accordance with IFRS, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Authority's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

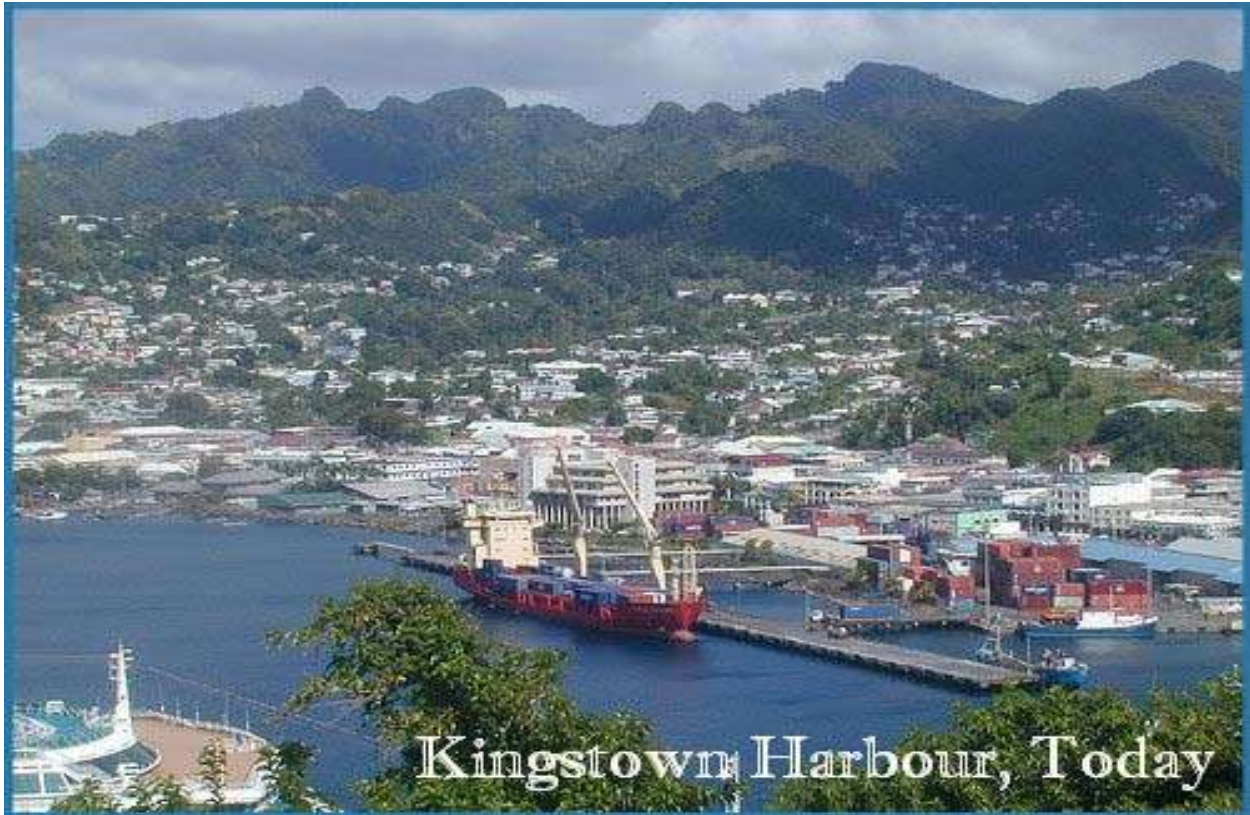

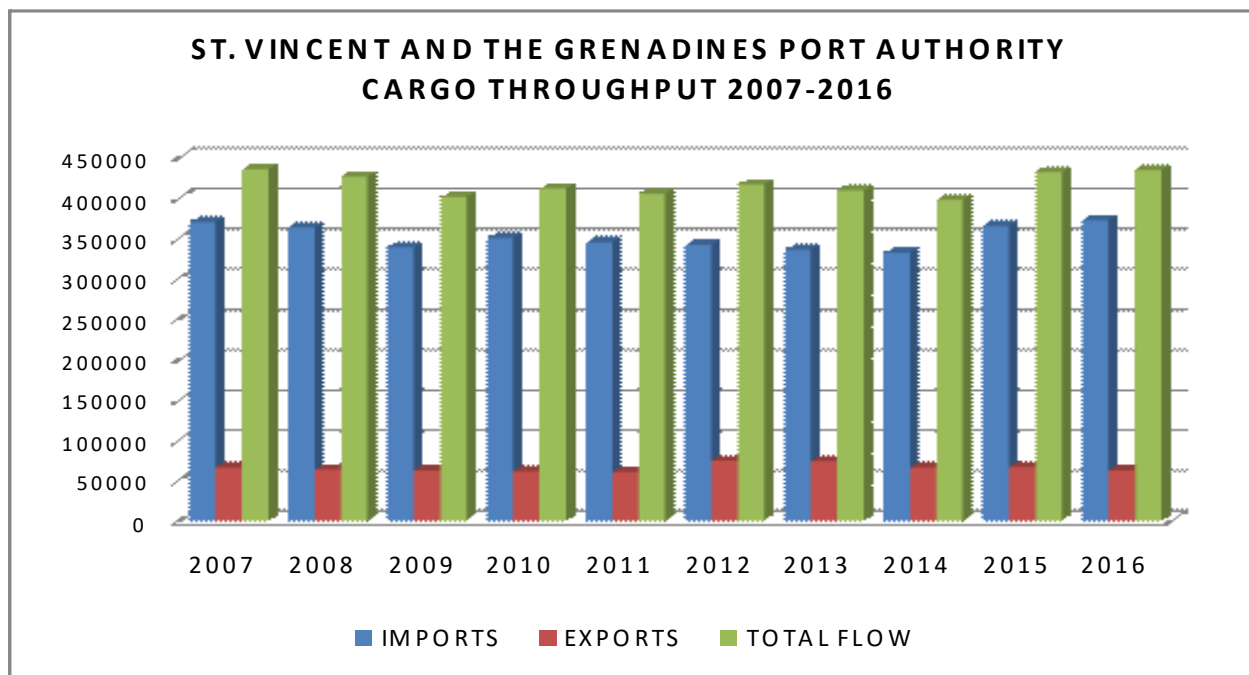

Imports for the year amounted to Three hundred and seventy-two thousand, four hundred and eighteen (372,418) tons; while exports recorded sixty-two thousand one hundred and five (62,105) ton, giving a total cargo throughput of 434,523 tons.

In comparison to 2015 imports increased by 1.99% or 7,249 tons, there was however a decline in exports of 1.04% or 4,497 tons, providing a total cargo flow increase of 0.6% for 2016. For additional details see pages (10-17)

Cruise ship season in St. Vincent and the Grenadines runs from the month of October through to April of the following year. During the 2015- 2016 season a total of two hundred and twenty two (222) calls carrying eighty four thousand, three hundred and six (84,306) passengers landed in Kingstown and four other ports of entry in the Grenadines (Bequia, Canouan, Mayreau and Union Island).

In comparison to the 2014-2015 season, the 2015-2016 cruise season experienced growth in both passengers and calls. Calls increased by 18.1% or 34 calls, while passengers increased by 3.3% or 2,716 passengers. Figures for 2014-2015 cruise season were eighty-one thousand, five hundred and ninety (81,590) passengers and one hundred and eighty-eight (188) calls.

The 2015-2016 cruise ship season also saw the Kingstown Cruise Berth and Ferry Terminal welcoming four new cruise ships. Inaugural calls were made by Aida Diva, Magellan, Ocean Princess and Costa Magica. (See pages 19 and 20 for data on cruise passenger arrivals and calls).

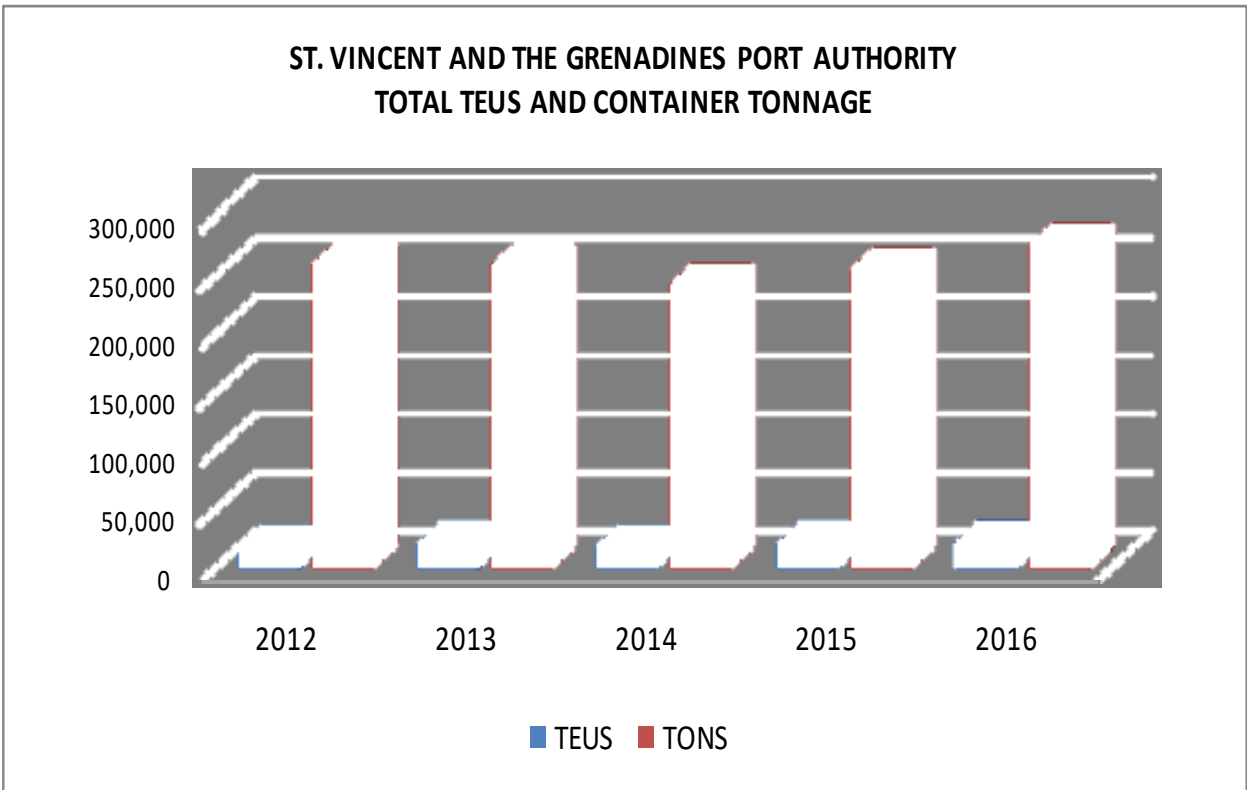

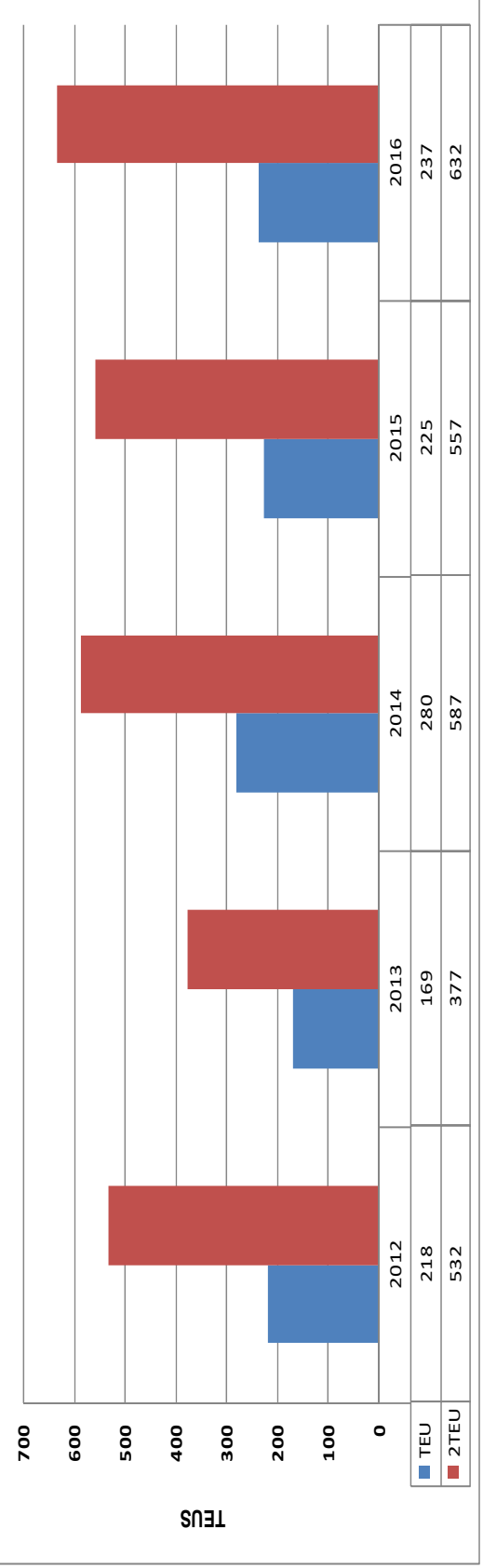

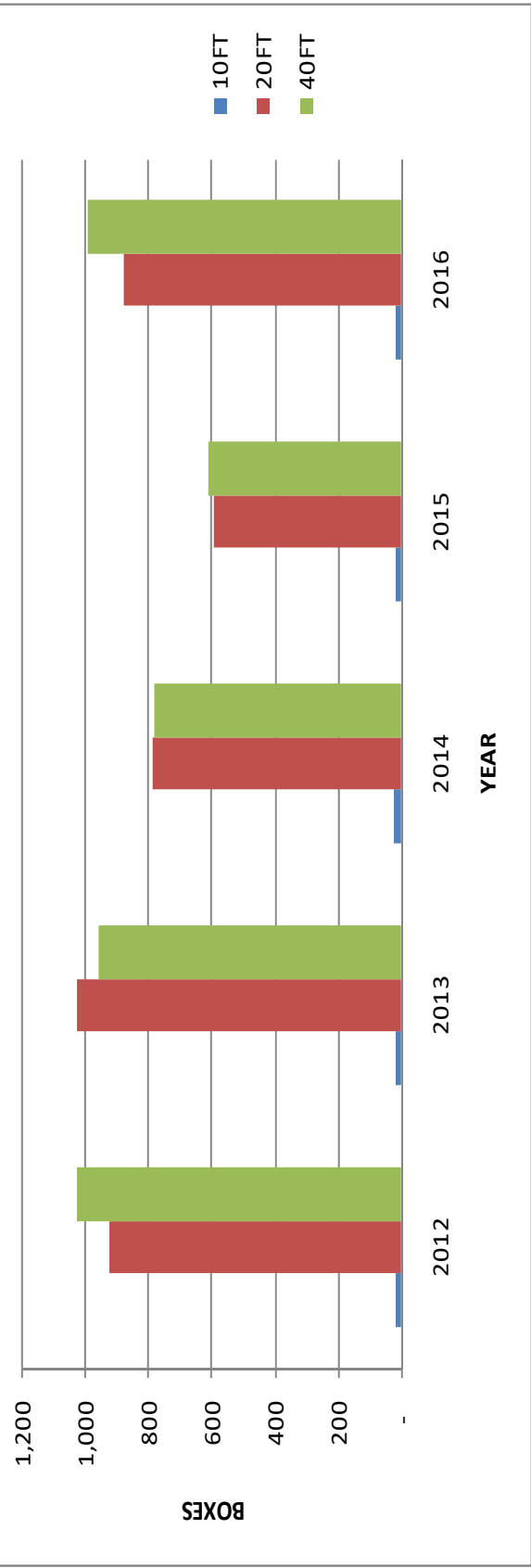
